

## PEDESTRIANIZATION 2020

### Rue Saint Paul Pedestrianizes Again!

In collaboration with the Old Montreal Société de développement commercial (SDC), the borough of Ville-Marie is allowing you to reclaim **rue Saint-Paul this summer, between rue du Marché-Bonsecours and boulevard Saint-Laurent, from May 21 to November 1**. Rue Saint-Paul will reopen to vehicular traffic on November 2. This pedestrianization is more than welcome in these difficult times, providing people with enough space to strictly adhere to distancing rules, as well as allowing for a little extra breathing room. Sidewalk cafés will be able to reopen to the public when public health authorities allow it.

#### TRAFFIC AND PARKING

Rue de Vaudreuil will flow two-way during the pedestrianization period, however the seven parking spaces reserved for residents will remain in place.

#### DELIVERIES

Deliveries must be made **between 7 a.m. and 11 a.m. Monday through Friday**.

#### MOVING

If you plan to move this summer, we invite you to obtain a public domain obstruction license at least **5 working days in advance**.

#### Household Waste and Recycling Collection

During pedestrianization, household waste and recycling collection services will remain unchanged. Businesses must place their materials on the curb **between 5 a.m. and 8 a.m. on collection days**.

#### NOISE

Be assured that several measures will be put in place to ensure the tranquility of area residents in terms of noise. If you have any complaints regarding excessive noise, contact the SPVM at 514 280-0121 / [spvm.qc.ca/fr/pdq21](http://spvm.qc.ca/fr/pdq21) or 311 to request the intervention of a city inspector.

#### SPVM

The SPVM will be present to ensure the security and tranquility of the premises. To support the police, a team of cadets will be deployed to the pedestrian area for the summer. As you are privileged witnesses, the SPVM requests your help and collaboration by informing them of any one-time or recurring situations in which they could assist or intervene. Whether it's incivility, theft, drug consumption or sale, or any other issue, you can call 911 or notify the police and cadets who patrol the area.
